NEW Exercise Classes at the Senior Center!

We are excited to announce that the Senior Center will now offer 2 Senior Vitality exercise classes to be held on the porch, one on Thursdays and one on Fridays. The classes will include a combination of movements and strength training that will gradually improve flexibility, range of motion, muscular strength, balance and cardiovascular endurance. Both classes will start the first week in November and require a doctor's order to participate. The registration form and physician permission slip are available at the Senior Center. Our classes are lead by Delnor staff and are 45 minutes long.

Thursday at 10:30 - 11:15 will be seated/standing exercise. Friday at 9:15 - 10:00 will be seated voga.

There is no charge for the classes, however you must be registered to participate.
