### First Aid/CPR/AED Training

Here's face-to-face training in basic first aid, cardio pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED). This program is designed for all adults, many of whom babysit their grandchildren, who would like to feel more competent and responsible in situations requiring first aid decisions. When you successfully complete this class, you will be certified to perform CPR on infants through adults, use an AED machine and provide basic first aid. The class will be offered by **Glen Baum,** a **Geneva Fire Department paramedic**, in a 1-day, 3-hour session, on Tuesday, January 26 at 10:00. There is a cost of \$10.00 for course materials. # Fourth Friday Lunch Bunch (FFLB)/ Bowling


