NEW PRESCRIPTION DRUG DISPOSAL PROGRAM

Disposing of unwanted, unused or expired prescription medications just got easier! A secure disposal unit purchased through donations from among others, the Central Kane County TRIAD, is now located in the front lobby of the St. Charles Police Department at 211 North Riverside Avenue, St. Charles. Geneva Township was a founding member of TRIAD and continues to support its efforts to prevent crimes that often victimize seniors and to sponsor educational safety programs of interest to those citizens. Regular monthly meetings are held at the Geneva Township Senior Center on the 3rd Friday of each month. Prescription medications (pills or liquid) in original containers are acceptable. It's not necessary to have labels on medications and it is recommended that labels containing personal information be removed prior to disposal at the St. Charles Police Department.

FOOD DRIVE CONTINUES

We are continuing to accept non-perishable food items that will be donated to a local food pantry. Thank you for the response to date! The Northern Illinois Food Bank has seen a 65 percent increase in need since 2005. Today, the food bank feeds 61,600 people every week through 665 partnering food banks. The need is great; if you haven't yet donated a non-perishable food item, consider dropping one off today. Donations will be accepted through Friday, December 17.

CHECK OUT WINTER DRINKS!

While coffee may be the most popular beverage at the Center - any season of the year -we're introducing something new for the winter months. Beginning **Wednesday, December 1**, a table with a carafe of hot water accompanied by envelopes of hot cocoa mix and new assorted teas will be located on the opposite side of the dining room from the regular drink and snack station.
