# TAX APPOINTMENTS

If you haven't already made an appointment to have an AARP tax preparer complete your tax return, call the Center soon and schedule a time. Appointment times are available on Tuesday and Thursday each week through April 14 and some dates are beginning to fill up. Appointments are required. When you come for your appointment, please remember to bring any documents necessary to complete your tax return. A partial list is included below but this list is not intended to represent everything that might be necessary to complete your return. New this year, please bring a photo ID (driver's license or state ID) and the original or a copy of your Social Security card. These documents are needed for both individuals if it's a joint return. In addition, for a joint return, both people must be present at the appointment to sign the return.

#### Copy of 2009 tax return

W-2 forms from each employer

- All 1099 forms (1099-INT, 1099-DIV, 1099 -misc., etc.) showing interest and/or dividends as well as documentation showing the original purchase price of your sold assets
- If you were paid Social Security benefits, bring your SSA-1099
- If you received a pension or annuity, bring your 1099R
- All forms indicating federal income tax paid
- If itemizing deductions, bring all receipts or canceled checks for items such as medical expenses, taxes paid, mortgage interest paid, and charitable contributions
