#### Free Flu Shot Clinic Reminder

Don't miss our annual free flu shot clinic scheduled for Monday, October 8 (Columbus Day) from 9:00 to 12:00 noon. Seniors signed up for Medicare Part B will have the cost of their flu shots covered by Medicare. Please bring your Medicare card. Geneva Township will pay the cost of the flu shot for any Geneva Township resident age 55+ not covered by Medicare Part B. For all others the cost of the flu shot is \$20.00 and the cost of the pneumonia shot is \$70.00. Again this year the DPT (diphtheria, tetanus, and Pertussis) shot will also be offered. The cost of the DPT shot is \$45.00. A doctor's prescription will be required for any shot other than the flu shot. Any payment must be by cash or check only. As always, complimentary refreshments will be served. If you have any questions or need transportation, please contact the Center at 630-232-3602.


