Memorial Day Commemoration

Geneva Township will once again observe Memorial Day Monday, May 29th by placing ceremonial 3' X 5' American flags on poles at each grave in Geneva Township of those killed in defense of our country. To honor those Geneva Township citizens killed in wartime and whose final resting places lay somewhere beyond our township, we will again erect a 23-flag tribute. The tribute will occur on Memorial Day on the plaza in front and west of the Center. At approximately 6:30 a.m. the Fox River-Geneva American Legion Post 75 Color Guard will perform a 21-gun rifle salute followed by the bugle call Taps. The Center will be open from 6:30 a.m. until 8:00 a.m. on Memorial Day for Township residents who wish to observe this moving tribute. Refreshments will be served in the Center dining room.

Honoring Those Who Have Made the Ultimate Sacrifice

During the placement of American flags on past Memorial Days (See article page 1), it was noticed that two headstones of "Geneva boys" who were killed in action, had over the years been damaged beyond repair.



Through the assistance of Supervisor Patrick Jaeger, Township Assistant Eileen Stocking, the Kane County Genealogical Society, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and next of kin, the Township arranged for the removal and the replacement of the headstone of Genevan Oscar Smith who died in the Spanish American War in 1881 and the headstone of Genevan Patrick Coyne who was killed in the battle for Iwo Jima in 1945. Take some time this Memorial Day to visit



Oak Hill Cemetery and West Side Cemetery. Look for the 3'x5' flags and you'll be able to view these new simple marble memorials and those of other brave Genevans who, as aptly stated by Abraham Lincoln "gave the last full measure of devotion" to our nation.
