Center Lunch Update

The Center has had an initial conversation with the new organization that will be assuming some of the food service operation previously handled by the Salvation Army Golden Diners. As many know, the Salvation Army ceased providing both home delivered meals and congregate dining at the end of February. We have been informed that it may be a few months before the new group is totally up and running. They have not yet opened an office in Kane County. We will be having discussions with the new organization as they make decisions about opening additional lunch sites. The Center will continue serving lunch to members Monday – Friday. A hot meal will be offered once a week (either Tues., Wed., or Thurs.) and assorted Subway sandwiches, chips, and drinks will be available on the other days. Frankfurters from Ream's Meat Market, Spaghetti, and Italian Beef sandwiches were menu selections the last three weeks. Every Friday we'll post the hot meal option for the next week including what day it will be served. We request that you make a lunch reservation at least two days in advance.
