Memorial Day Remembrance

Geneva Township's annual Memorial Day commemoration will be held on **Monday, May 27th**. Ceremonial 3' X 5' American flags are placed at each grave in Geneva Township of those killed in defense of our country. To honor those Geneva Township citizens killed in wartime and whose final resting places lay somewhere beyond our township, we will again erect a 23-flag tribute on the plaza in front and west of the Center. At approximately 6:30 a.m. the Fox River-Geneva American Legion Post 75 Color Guard will perform a 21-gun rifle salute followed by the bugle call Taps. The Center will be open from 6:30 a.m. until 8:00 a.m. on Memorial Day for Township residents who wish to observe this moving tribute. Refreshments will be served in the Center dining room.

Starved Rock Land & Water Cruise

On Wednesday, July 24 a Center group will travel south to Starved Rock State Park. Starved Rock's cultural history can be traced to 8000 B.C., with Native Americans tribes and European explorers documenting villages and encampments near the park along the banks of the Illinois River. The park is one of Illinois' most beautiful destinations. The tour begins with lunch in the historic dining room at the Lodge, followed by a narrated trolley tour with history and legends of the area. The trolley will then take you to the river boat "Eagle I" where you will see the east end of the Starved Rock State Park area by water. There are restrooms available throughout the tour and minimal walking is involved. The total inclusive cost of \$50 covers round-trip coach bus transportation, lunch in the Lodge, and the trolley and water tours. Members are encouraged to register early for this trip. We anticipate a 9:15am departure from the Center and the group will leave Starved Rock to return to the Center at approximately 3:00 pm.

August Rush Reminder
