# The Center Newsletter

## Wellness Matters!

Please read some illness prevention and health advice included below that applies to your time at the Center or elsewhere. 1. Follow the "six-foot rule" with anyone who seems sick. When someone with the flu or other virus coughs, sneezes, or even talks, the virus is expelled via almost invisible respiratory droplets-which others unknowingly inhale. This is a frequent way people become infected. 2. Thoroughly wash your hands often (for at least 20 seconds) after you shake hands, for example, or handle an object someone else has touched, such as a computer keyboard, phone or door handle. When you can't wash your hands with soap and water, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer. 3. When out in public, always avoid touching your lips, nose, or eyes. At home, do so only after washing your hands. Wash your hands immediately after arriving home. 4. If you are sick with a fever, cough, or shortness of breath stay home so you don't infect others and consult your healthcare provider. Remember, every room in the Center has hand sanitizer and tissues for your use.

# **AARP** Tax Preparation Continues

Volunteer AARP income tax preparers are busy this year! Members can make an appointment to meet with a preparer at the Center on Tuesday or Thursday every week. Your 2019 Federal and IL tax returns will be completed and electronically filed. Most tax forms including 1040EZ, 1040A, and 1040 with schedules can be completed. A photo ID (driver's license, State ID, passport), social security card or Individual Taxpayer Identification notice, a copy of last year's tax return, all income documents like W-2's and 1099's, brokerage statements, and any other tax information specific to your situation must be presented at your appointment. A printed list of essential documents is available at the Center office. There is no cost for this service. However, appointments are required. Call the Center at 630/232-3602 to schedule an appointment.
