

CENTER SAFETY MEASURES

REQUIRED MASKING

For entry and while in the Township Center, ALL Members and Staff are RE-QUIRED to wear an approved medical grade face mask covering the wearer's nose and mouth. No exceptions.

COVID-19 BOOSTER SHOTS

There are booster recommendations from the CDC for all three available COVID-19 vaccines in the United States. Eligible individuals may choose which vaccine they receive as a booster. The CDC states you can stay with your original type or "mix & match" the type of vaccination for your booster shot. For those who received a Pfizer-BioNTech or a Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, the following groups are eligible for a booster shot at 6 months or more after their second dose was received, (check your CDC Vaccination Record Card for that date):

- · 65 years and older
- · Age 18+ who live in long-term care settings
- · Age 18+ who have underlying medical conditions
- · Age 18+ who work or live in high-risk settings

For people who got the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine, a booster is also recommended for those 18 and older who were vaccinated 2 or more months ago. Booster shots are available at the Kane County Vax Hub (501 N. Randall Rd, Batavia) in the old Sam's Club. To schedule an appointment, visit KaneVax.org. Walk-ins are welcome, too. Boosters are also available at local pharmacies. Call your chosen pharmacy to determine what vaccine types are available and to make an appointment.
