On Wednesday, October 25th at 10:30 a.m. join the Center book club for a discussion about this month's selection, The Wager: A Tale of Shipwreck, Mutiny and Murder by David Grann. Everyone's welcome! On January 28, 1742, a ramshackle vessel of patchedtogether wood and cloth washed up on the coast of Brazil. Inside were thirty emaciated men, barely alive, and they had an extraordinary tale to tell. They were survivors of His Majesty's Ship the Wager, a British vessel that had left England in 1740 on a secret mission during an imperial war with Spain. They were greeted as heroes. Six months later, another, even more decrepit craft landed on the coast of Chile. This boat contained just three castaways, and they told a very different story. As accusations of treachery and murder flew, the Admiralty convened a court martial to determine who was telling the truth. Copies of the book will be available at the Geneva Library (Book Club area on the 1st floor). Books in this section are returned to the shelf after 15 days.
