Asian Odyssey: China, India, Tibet features pictures of Asisan art objects including early Chinese tomb sculptures, food vessels, porcelain vases and enamel decorated dishes. Vial of Life Program

Included with this newsletter is a clean Vial of Life form so you can update the information on the form you presently have in the vial in your refrigerator. If there are two people in your household with information in the vial, please make

a copy of the clean form before filling it out with the second person's information. Take a moment right now to fill out the form (one per person) and replace the old one with your new information. All forms should be in only one vial and placed in your refrigerator on the left side of the top shelf.

The Vial of Life program provides seniors with a vial that is used to store a medical information form that emergency medical personnel will find in a resident's refrigerator when they see the Vial of Life magnet posted on the front of the refrigerator. Your private medical information never leaves your possession until it is needed by emergency personnel.
